

## You can save animals by purchasing cruelty-free products!

Hundreds of thousands of animals are poisoned, blinded, and killed every year in outdated and ineffective product tests for household cleaners, cosmetics, personal care products and even fruit juices. Although more than 500 companies have banned animal testing, some corporations still do it. These tests aren't required by law, and they often produce inaccurate and misleading results because even if a product causes blindness in an animal, it can still be marketed to you.

Compassionate companies are now focusing their research where the best hope of treatment lies: with humans. They understand that we can improve treatments through non-animal methods, and they fund only non-animal research. Besides saving countless animal lives, alternatives to animal tests are efficient and reliable. Scientists have developed sophisticated product tests that are faster, cheaper, and far more accurate than blinding and poisoning tests. Human cell cultures and tissue studies (*in vitro* tests) and artificial human "skin" and "eyes" mimic the body's natural properties, and a number of computer virtual organs serve as accurate models of human body parts. While effective non-animal test methods become more and more numerous, animal-based toxicology remains, as researcher Thomas Hartung wrote, "frozen in time, using and accepting the same old animal models again and again, often without stringent examination of their validity."

## What You Can Do

Write to the heads of the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency, the Food and Drug Administration, the National Toxicology Program, and Health Canada and urge them to stop allowing cruel and obsolete animal tests and to allow companies to substitute *in vitro* tests.
